

Utah Consumer Bill of Rights Regarding Towing

Effective 01/01/2023

- The consumer has the right to know they are being charged an appropriate fee. Towing fees are established by the Utah Department of Transportation under Utah Code Annotated §72-9-603 and Utah Administrative Code R909-19. <http://www.udot.utah.gov/main/f?p=100:pg:::::1:T,V:396>

The consumer can verify it has been reported at www.tow.utah.gov. The consumer has a right to ask for documentation that the vehicle has been entered into the Impound Vehicle System showing the date and time storage began.
- The tow truck motor carrier, driver(s) and vehicle(s) must comply with Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations. <http://udot.utah.gov>. Click on the Motor Carrier Division link.
- The consumer has the right to file a complaint alleging: overcharges, inadequate certifications for the driver, truck, company and violations of Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, Utah Code Annotated or Utah Administrative Code. A complaint may be filed with the Utah Department of Transportation, at www.udot.utah.gov by clicking on the Motor Carrier Division link, then clicking on tow trucks link.

Rates for vehicles rated 26,001 lbs. or more

Non-Consent Police Generated Tow

Fee – Up to \$401 per hour
Storage Fee (outside) - Up to \$60 per day
Administrative Fee – Up to \$40
Fuel Surcharge (if applicable) – See R909-19-14
Recovery Operations – Vehicle owner must agree to additional “Recovery” fee prior to initiating additional charges.

Tow Fee – Up to \$401
Drop Fee - \$200
Storage Fee (outside) - up to \$60 per day
Administrative Fee – Up to \$40
After Hours Fee - Up to \$75
Fuel Surcharge (if applicable) – See R909-19-14
