

Utah Consumer Bill of Rights Regarding Towing

Effective 1/1/2024

- The consumer has the right to know they are being charged an appropriate fee. Towing fees are established by the Utah Department of Transportation under Utah Code Annotated §72-9-603 and Utah Administrative Code R909-19. <https://site.utah.gov/connect/business/motor-carriers/tow-trucks/towing-fee-schedule/>
