- ☒ If guns are in our home, they are kept unloaded & locked away.

- ☒ Household cleaners, medicines, & vitamins are stored out of young kids' reach.
- ☒ Our home has emergency numbers near telephones & first aid supplies.

To Do List: Fire Safety Around the House



For Kids

There are things you can do to help keep you and your household safe:

1. Check each bedroom for a working smoke alarm.
2. Test the smoke alarm in your room so you know what it sounds like.
3. Find two ways out of every room.
4. Memorize your address, phone number, and two emergency contact numbers.



For Kids & Parents

Work with your parents to keep your family safe:

1. Make a fire escape plan.
2. Set a family meeting place.
3. Visit www.safekids.org for more helpful hints.
4. Practice a fire drill with the whole household 2 times per year.
5. Maintain a clean, clutter-free path to safety from each room.



For Parents

Only adults should be in charge of these safety issues:

1. Make sure space heaters, fireplaces and electrical devices are used correctly.
2. Cooking food is primarily an adult job. Do not leave stoves and ovens unattended.
3. Check that electrical cords are in good shape, outlets are not overloaded, and extension cords are not used permanently.
4. Fire extinguishers are maintained on every floor of the house.
5. Lighters & matches are kept securely out of reach of children.
