PROVISIONAL CONCEALED FIREARM PERMIT

The State of Utah recently established a provisional permit to carry a concealed firearm for individuals at least 18 years of age, but no more than 20 years of age, who meet statutory eligibility requirements. This new law became effective May 9, 2017, and Utah Concealed Firearm Permit Instructors began offering instruction to 18 to 20 year olds April 1, 2017.

The application requirements for the provisional permit are identical to the standard 21 and over permit; however, there are some important differences between the two permits.

- Provisional Permit holders may not carry a concealed firearm on or about the premises of a public or private elementary or secondary school.
- Provisional Permit holders may not use their permit to purchase a handgun from a federal firearm licensee.
- Regardless of issue date, all Utah Provisional Permits expire on the permit holders 21st birthday.

It is the responsibility of all instructors and permit holders to read and understand the laws and rules pertaining to this provisional permit. Officers taking enforcement action against provisional permit holders should follow the same procedure they would with a standard permit.

NIBRS FILE NAME FORMAT

NIBRS files that are submitted to BCI will now need to be named in a new format. This is part of the process of switching over to the web app uploading of NIBRS submissions. The format is as follows:

NEW NIBRS REPORT FORMAT

In May, BCI completed the transfer of UCR data to a new database. You will start to see some changes to the reports that you receive. The NIBRS re-write is going forward so that BCI will be able to accept all the data that the FBI requires. We will keep you updated on progress towards this.

The NIBRS reports that you have been receiving have been changed to a different format – the same information is on the report, but the report itself is in a different format.

You used to receive the number of incidents processed, the number of errors and the percentage in a letter format in an email. This has changed to text file format – this will be an attachment that may be opened using any text software such as WordPad, Notepad, Word, etc.

The first portion of the report:

Utah has processed 100% of the records your agency submitted Processed: 67 Unprocessed: 0

This tells you that the file has finished processing. If there isn't "100%", then the file is still processing on the server, don't view the results as it won't be complete. View the results after that number has reached 100%.

The second part of the report:

Total records submitted to Utah: 67
GroupA records submitted to Utah: 56
GroupB records submitted to Utah: 11

This portion of the report indicates how many incidents were submitted, and then breaks it down into Group A and Group B.

Utah Processing Results
 Accepted[Good]: 67 = 100%
 Rejected[Bad]: 0 = 0%

The "Rejected [Bad]:" number is the error percentage that was listed in the email that you received after each submission.

Please look at these every month so that you will know if everything is being submitted. For example, if you don't have any Group B arrest on your report, but your agency has had several Group B arrests you will know that there was a problem with this file.

The last portion of this report will give you the percentage of the incidents that were good and those that had errors. It will also tell you if there were any deleted records in this submission.

The Admin Report is now the "PostingSuccessReport" report and the Error Report is now the "PostingErrorResults". The format for these reports will remain the same.

Occasionally there will be some different information – depending on what is submitted in your file.

Here are some examples:

Delete requests for records that do
not exist[Ignored]: 8

This indicates that there were deletes included in this submission file that didn't exist in our database. You can choose to ignore this or you can look in the submission and the PostingSuccessReport and compare the data to see what incidents were requested to be deleted.

If you get this error:

SERVER ERROR (PLEASE NOTIFY BCI):1

[ALL RECORD PROCESSING STOPPED

UNTIL SERVER ERROR IS FIXED]:1

NEW FEE FOR CHALLENGING UCH RECORDS

Beginning July 1st, 2017, BCI will start charging a \$15.00 fee when an individual challenges information on their Utah criminal history record. In the past, people have been able to challenge their criminal history records for free, but during the past legislative session the legislature decided to apply a fee for this service.
