8:00-8:30 am: Land Use Academy of Utah (LUAU)

Speakers: *ULCT’s Meg Ryan & Senate President Wayne Niederhauser*

Objective: Provide online training for local elected and appointed officials about land use law

Did you know: ULCT, Property Rights Coalition, Utah Realtors Association, and the Utah Legislature created LUAU

Did you know: it took 177 years for Utah to reach 1 million residents, and just 35 years for Utah to reach 2 million more residents

8:30-9:00 am: Water: Prep 60

Speakers: *Richard Bay, General Manager of Jordan Valley Water Conservancy Dist.; Tage Flint, General Manager of Weber/Basin Water Conservancy Dist.; Mark Stratford, Ogden Ass’t City Attorney*

Objective: Explain the effort to gather accurate data about water use in cities, towns, and districts,

Did you know: Utah receives the second lowest annual rainfall of any state, but uses the most water per capita of any state

Did you know: Utah’s population will double between today and 2060, with 80% of that growth occurring in Utah, Salt Lake, Washington, Davis, and Weber Counties, creating \$33 billion in water infrastructure needs for Utah by 2060

9:00-9:30 am: Health care reform—are we there yet?

Speaker: *Greg Matis, Deputy General Counsel for Intermountain Health Care (IHC)*

Objective: Learn what health care reform means to you and your community

Did you know: Health care costs are 33% of the State of Utah’s budget and growing

9:30-10:00 am: Wildland fire policy

Speakers: *Sandy Council Member Steve Fairbanks, ULCT’s Cameron Diehl, and Forestry, Fire, & State Lands Director Brian Cottam*

Objective: ULCT working group needs your feedback on the proposal for the state to cover wildland fire suppression costs and for municipalities to cover costs and efforts to prevent and mitigate wildland fire

Did you know: in 2012, 1,000+ wildland fires scorched over 422,000 acres in Utah at a cost of over \$50 million—the equivalent of burning 90% of Salt Lake County’s land mass

10:00-10:30 am: Law enforcement—what came and what is coming?

Speakers: *ULCT’s Cameron Diehl and Nick Jarvis, Ogden Mayor Mike Caldwell, and Bountiful Police Chief Tom Ross*

Objective: Outline the public safety bills that we anticipate in the 2016 legislative session so that you can engage with legislators

Did you know: the 2015 legislature considered 89 bills that impacted law enforcement, which was 11% of all bills (831)

10:30-11:00 am: Proposition 1 (local option for transportation)

Speakers: *ULCT 1st Vice President/Holladay Council Member Lynn Pace, Utah Transit Authority Board Chair H. David Burton*

Objective: Ensure you know what you can and cannot do to support Proposition 1

Did you know: 111 cities and towns passed resolutions about Proposition 1 and 17 counties acted to put Proposition 1 on the ballot in 2015, representing 86% of the state’s population

Did you know: ULCT staff has prepared financial data, “dos and don’ts,” and a 500 word template to guide you and your community’s involvement on Proposition 1 (www.ulct.org/legislative-wrap-up)

11:00-11:10 am: Ratify new ULCT board members
