Office of the State Auditor Releases Three Audits of Public Education Programs

Salt Lake City, UTAH –

The Office of the State Auditor (Office) today released three audits of public education programs. The Office released a Performance Audit of Local Education Agency (LEA) Compliance with Procurement Requirements, its annual audit of the Minimum School Program (MSP), and its annual audit of the UPSTART Program.

The Office appreciates the willingness of the Utah State Board of Education (USBE) to continue to improve their efforts to provide appropriate oversight of the system of public education. The Utah Constitution vests the USBE with "general control and supervision of the public education system."

The USBE functions as a regulator of LEAs and has fiduciary responsibility as a grant administrator. The complexities of the system of public education create increased challenges associated with adequate USBE oversight.

The Office appreciates the recognition and willingness of the State Charter School Board to improve its oversight of charter schools and to ensure their compliance with the contractual obligation contained within their charters.
