DEFINITION: San Juan County EMS Employees are considered full-time employees who work a rotating shift. Serves as driver, attendant or stand-by employee. Checks, cleans and maintains ambulance and equipment while on duty. Responds to emergency and non-emergency ambulance calls. Cares for, treats and transports the sick and injured. Any additional tasks given by San Juan County EMS Director. Follow state and local protocol's ***This is identified as a safety-sensitive position***

EDUCATION: High School Diploma or equivalent. Maintain State of Utah Advanced EMT (AEMT) or Paramedic. All certifications required (Health Care CPR) must be from the American Heart Association (AHA). It is recommended that applicants have ACLS, PEPP or PALS, ITLS or PHTLS, ICS 100,200 NIMS 700,800 or be able to obtain within 1 year of employment

WORK HISTORY: Emergency Medical Services (EMS) related experience is preferred.

LICENSES AND CERTIFICATIONS:

It is the responsibility of the employee to acquire and maintain the following licenses and certifications and to meet insurance requirements.

The following certifications are required before applying:

- Current Utah driver's license (No major Moving Violations in the past 3 years)
- High School Diploma or equivalent

- State of Utah Advanced EMT (AEMT) or Paramedic certification
- National Registry AEMT or Paramedic (preferred however not required)
- Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation Certification Health Care Provider (CPR) from the American Heart Association (AHA).

The following certifications must be obtained within 1 year of employment

- FEMA Incident Command System (ICS) 100 and 200
- FEMA National Incident Management System (NIMS) 700
- Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) Certification from the American Heart Association (AHA).
- One or the other: American Heart Association Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS) Certification or Pediatric Education Pre-hospital Professional (PEPP) Certification.
- American Heart Association (AHA) BLS CPR instructor certification
- Recommended: Utah Department of EMS Instructor certification.
- Reccomended: International Trauma Life Support (ITLS) Certification or Pre-Hospital Trauma Life Support (PHTLS) Certification

ESSENTIAL JOB REQUIREMENTS:

San Juan County EMS Employees must successfully complete and pass the pre-employment psychomotor test and interview, the pre employment drug. San Juan County EMS Employees must be able to communicate both verbally and in writing to all personnel; complete paperwork, such as call sheets and other business forms as instructed by the business office; to communicate verbally with other emergency medical service or health care providers about the care and treatment of patients, via radio transmission and with patient during assessment and treatment. San Juan County EMS Employees must be currently licensed to drive motor vehicles by the Utah Department of Transportation and meet insurance requirements for ambulance drivers.

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS/DUTIES:

- Serves as driver, attendant or stand-by employee.
- Checks, cleans and maintains ambulance and equipment while on duty.
- Responds to emergency and non-emergency ambulance calls.
- Cares for, treats and transports the sick and injured.
- Checks out, cleans equipment and completes other daily duties including, maintaining building and crew quarters and stocking and cleaning ambulances in accordance with a schedule and while on shift or when called into work.
- Participates in required training and assigned committee activities.
- Attends all mandatory meetings and in-services.

- Participates in company-sponsored community activities as directed.
- Carries all state and federal certificates and licenses while on-duty.
- Abides by all Company policies and procedures.
- Completes any and other duties as assigned.
- Assists EMS Director and Training officer as assigned.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

Must be able to work during emergencies situations, make decisions based on information available, work under stress, be able to lift fifty pounds, work in all types of weather and conditions. Must be able to work long hours, and travel long distances in the back of ambulances. Must maintain general good health.
