

RESOLUTION NO. 2018-06-22R

A RESOLUTION OF THE AMERICAN FORK CITY COUNCIL ADOPTING THE 2018 FIREWORKS RESTRICTIONS.

WHEREAS, American Fork City wishes to protect vulnerable areas from the risk of fire; and

WHEREAS, American Fork City wishes to support the Fire Department's efforts to limit the risk of fire;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE AMERICAN FORK CITY COUNCIL as follows:

Section 1.

A. Fireworks will be allowed to be discharged at the following parks:

Park	Approximate address
Evergreen Park	200 North 700 East
Val Vista Park	1300 North 1100 East
Art Dye Park	550 East 1000 North
Hindley Park	400 North 560 West
Greenwood Park	200 East 500 South
Legacy Park	70 West 1340 North

B. Fireworks shall only be discharged at the above referenced parks and in accordance with the map of approved parks (See Exhibit A) during July 2-5 and July 22-25 and following the legally prescribed time periods (ending at 11 p.m. on all nights, except the 4th and 24th which go until Midnight) as allowed by State law.

C. Any fireworks that discharge over 150-feet vertically or requires special permitting (more than 1.4G classification) or handling shall follow the city prescribed application and permitting process for Special Events.

D. Any firework legally sold in the State of Utah can be discharged at the approved parks

E. All fireworks should maintain a safe a distance from trees, combustible vegetation, and structures. Safety and precautions shall be considered including the availability of water or a fire extinguisher.

F. The Fire Chief, Fire Marshal or designee reserve the right to restrict fireworks or recreational burns in any high-risk geographical area inside the city of American Fork may be at risk or has a potential safety concern.

Section 2.


This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its approval and adoption.
